2434a CBC had not removed the unauthorised yellow lines at the bottom of Church Road. (Nov 2022). The Clerk had spoken to John Baker about these and although an order had been raised no date was given for their removal. CBCllr Baker would be asked again to chase this.

2544a The Chair of the Greensand Trust had not replied to an email sent to invite him to a future meeting. PCllr McQuillan agreed to contact Steben Smith via the Greensand Trust.869

A working party had been set up with Mr Shirville and PCllr McKay researching CCTV. They reported back that CBC had been quite negative about the proposals. Quoted were being sourced to get a better idea of costs for a first phase comprising of a CCTV camera at the bottom of Church Road and in the second phase a new streetlight at the top of Church Road and CCTV.

2654 Roads and Footpaths

Actions carried forward:

2263a BOAT at the top of Church Road – gates had been installed and re-installed when pulled out the ground. The gates had been unlocked due to logging works in the woods. The Greensand Trust would be asked about putting up signs to say where alternative parking could be found with Longslade Lane suggested.
