Actions carried forward:

2814 Anti-social behaviour at the Royal Oak Pub. PCllr Wilson had visited the pub but there seemed to be a lack of interest in working with local residents. Once the CCTV cameras were installed it was hoped that the Parish Council would be in a better position to help residents evidence the anti-social behaviour they were experiencing. Residents would be able to ask the Parish Council to look at CCTV footage if they were concerned about anti-social behaviour.

2952 Chairman's Report

Actions carried forward:

2935 Members on Planning sub-committee– PCllrs Harris, McQuillan, McKay (to check if PCllr Jones wishes to be added)

2938 An email had been sent to the Council from a group wanting to decorate the Church with knitted poppy displays. The Parish Council had no say over the siting of them as they

were on Church property. Reverend Diana Young was having a meeting to discuss the displays in the next few days. It was asked who was involved in the group and could local people join. PCllr Smith would ask these questions.

2953 Roads and Footpaths

Actions carried forward:

2370b To Discuss New Signage for Sandy Lane to Restrict Unnecessary Access

The Clerk had asked for the sign to be moved. Zaria Bettles had stated there was little money to remove or replace the sign as broken signs were a priority. She would make a site visit and let the Council know if anything would be done

2859 The black paint was coming off of the road where it had been painted over the yellow (unofficial) lines close to Narrow Path and 25 Church Road. CBC would either need to re-paint them or burn off the yellow lines. The Clerk had reported this on FixMyStreet and it was discussed at the AGM but nothing had been done. Members would keep adding this to FixMy Street in the hope that this would be actioned.

2891 Residents complained of ongoing issues on BOAT 33 including fly tipping, increased parking at the top of Church Road including overnight campers and noise from 4x4s accessing the BOAT and damaging the surface. CBC were monitoring the situation. A resident had complained to CBC about the tree root damage and the surface erosion. PCllr Smith had asked CBCllr Baker for an update. Residents were encouraged to contact CBC with any complaints.

2687 CBC had rejected the Parish Council's request for a 20mph Speed Limit on Church Road. Residents were overwhelmingly in support of reducing the speed limit. The Parish Council would keep pushing for speed restrictions. PCllr Wilson had looked through documents and found both national and local legislation which showed CBC had acted against their own policies.

2954 Lighting

Actions carried forward:

2940 It was reported that a streetlight on the left outside Aspley Court was staying on during the day. This would be checked and then the Clerk would report.

2955 Installation of CCTV

Actions carried forward:

2877 CCTV PCllr McKay was still trying to find a local maintenance provider.

2956 Planning

Actions carried forward:

2911 Land between Brogborough, Lidlington and Marston Moretaine – Outline planning application for 5000 homes. The Outline Planning Application had been approved by CBC. It was requested that the full decision notice be asked for so members could see all the information. The Clerk had contacted the relevant Planning Officer at CBC for this.

2911a Land adjacent to 10 Silverbirches – variation of plans

The Parish Council had responded to this first Variation of Condition (VOC). The plans for the garage did not meet the necessary width identified by CBC for a double garage. The Parish Council was concerned that CBC did not make decisions in line with their own policies. PCllr McKay would raise this with CBCllr Baker.

2942 Steetley Quarry, Aspley Woods – temporary car parking for 3 years (27/5)

The Parish Council were supportive of the application to offer free parking but would only support this if it was made permanent. A caveat would also be added that support was conditional upon toilets being added in the woods. There was concern that bike users had to cross Woburn Road which had a speed limit of 40mph. It was hoped that the speed limit would be lowered. PCllr Harris would draft the response.

2942a Land Adjacent to 10 Silverbirches Lane – Variation of condition no. 2 of planning permission CB/26/02648/FULL. (21/5) This was for more windows and to change a flat roof to a pitched roof. The plans would need to be compared however the revised parking had only been received that afternoon (20th May). The Parish Council would write to CBC to express their concerns with the parking area and the slope leading to the garage which did not allow for the parking shown. The application deadline had been extended until 12th June.
